## CWS AWARDED WEDOWEE PROJECT

CWS is celebrating the addition of a new project to our portfolio - the Wedowee Utilities Board - located in Randolph County, AL near the Alabama/Georgia state line. The contract includes full management and operations for the town's water treatment plant, a Grade 4 surface water facility that serves their community of 719 residents. As part of the transition of the project, CWS also welcomed four new employees who rolled over the Town to employment with CWS.

## CWS CLIENT SIGNS 15-YEAR CONTRACT

The Inlet Beach Water System signed a 15-year contract (nope...that's not a typo!) with CWS to operate its water and sewer systems. In 2021, CWS was hired by the IBWS on a month-tomonth basis to provide professional O&M services for both systems. The water system includes three water wells and a water treatment facility that uses Chlorine injection and Hydrogen Peroxide (for sulfur, iron and manganese oxidation). It also utilizes one 100,000 gallon water tank and 15 miles of water main to serve its 1,000 customers. On the sewer collection system, there are 18 lift stations, as well as 14 miles of force main and gravity sewer.

A 15-year contract is a huge win for our company. It also serves as recognition for a job well done. Congratulations to everyone involved in its success!
